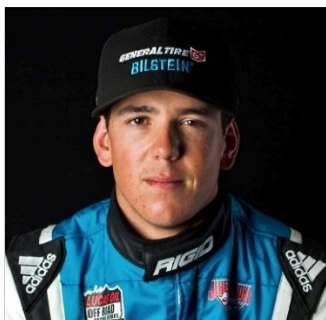

Glen Helen Raceway



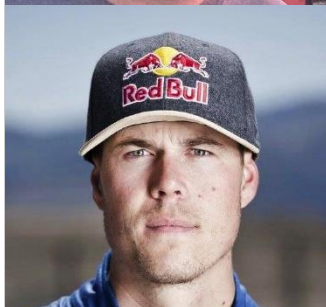
Jerett Brooks is a first-generation racer that started racing Trophy Karts at the age of 9. He is a two-time X-Games athlete and six-time Stadium Super Truck competitor. Now 20, Jerett has already amassed thirty career wins, establishing himself as a proven winner and championship contender. He won his first pro-class championship as a rookie in the TORC Series at only 17 years old, and last year, at age 19 won the Pro Lite Championship in the Lucas Off-Road Racing Series. Jerett is in the hunt for a second consecutive Pro Lite Championship, with one race left in the series. Jerett has also been racing Pro 2, where he is a contender for 2017 Rookie of the Year honors.



CJ Greaves took up motocross at an early age, but the call of short-course racing was too strong. He began his off-road career at age 14, and earned his first title in The Off Road Championship Series (TORC) Super Buggy class that same year. CJ moved to Pro 2, earning the title in 2014, 2015, and 2016. He continues to make quite an Impact in the world of Short Course racing. He and his father, Johnny Greaves, often battle wheel-to-wheel for the win. CJ dominated the TORC series yet again this season, winning the Pro Stock UTV Championship, Pro Mod UTV Championship (with a 12-win streak), and the Pro 4 Championship—for the third year in a row.



Jeremy McGrath is a multi-sport champion, with seven Supercross Championships, 2 FIM World Championships, and five overall X Games medals. He has been inducted into the AMA Motorcycle Hall of Fame, and the BMX Hall of Fame. Jeremy has found success in every discipline of racing, and short course is no exception. Jeremy competes in the Lucas Oil Off-Road Racing Series (LOORRS). He describes driving a 900 horsepower Pro 2 truck as, “motocross and Supercross, mixed in with a little bit of NASCAR, and a little bit of monster truck. The first time I did it, I was blown away.” He is currently the points leader in the LOORRS Pro 2 class, with four wins—more than any other driver.



Bryce Menzies is another athlete who has excelled in many endeavors. Bryce created quite a buzz last year, when he launched his Pro 2 truck to a new Guinness World Record distance jump of more than 300 feet. Setting the record came at a cost, however, and Bryce missed the 2016 Crandon World Cup and several other races, including the Dakar Rally, due to lingering injuries from the jump attempts. We’re honoring Bryce here for the Impact he made on his return to Crandon for the 2017 World Cup. Bryce was in top form, holding off some tough competition, racing three races in one day. Three races, and three wins for Bryce. He swept the Pro-2 and Pro-4 races, as well as the 2017 Crandon World Cup, in front of 50,000 fans.



Carl Renezeder is one of the most successful drivers in short course racing history, with more than 120 short course national event wins. He has won nine short course off-road racing championships. Carl was also the first driver in short-course off-road racing history to win championships in both two wheel drive and four wheel drive trophy trucks in the same season, when he won the 2009 Unlimited 2 and Unlimited 4 divisions in the Lucas Oil Off Road Racing Series (LOORRS). Carl has made an Impact over his nineteen year short course career, but even more so this year, as he has announced his retirement from the sport. Carl has three wins in his Pro 4 farewell season.
